1. INTRODUCTION

The President of AIUA; Prof. Dr. Haji Munzir Hitam, opened the meeting by welcoming all delegates to Ternate, North Moluccas, Indonesia and proceeded with the recitation of Surah al-Fatihah.

2. WELCOMING REMARKS FROM THE HOST UNIVERSITY, BY THE RECTOR OF INSTITUT AGAMA ISLAM NEGERI (IAIN) TERNATE, NORTH MOLUCCAS, INDONESIA

2.1 Dr. Abdul Rahman Merasabessy, the Rector of Institut Agama Islam Negeri (IAIN) Ternate, North Moluccas, Indonesia, expressed his thanks for the opportunity to host the 6th AIUA Meeting and the Biennial AGM. He welcomed and expressed his gratitude to all delegates for their attendance. He bid for the meeting to run smoothly and apologized for any shortcomings.

3. INTRODUCTION OF NEW AIUA MEMBERS

3.1 The meeting received a motion from Institut Agama Islam Negeri (IAIN) Ternate for Institut Agama Islam (IAI) As-Siddiq Kie Raha, North Moluccasto be accepted as a new AIUA member. The AIUA constitution stated that only the AIUA founding members have the right to vote for, approve and accept new AIUA members. The AIUA founding institutions in attendance were as following:

- i. Universitas Islam Negeri Sultan Syarif Kasim (UIN SUSKA),

- ii. Universiti Sultan Azlan Shah (USAS),
- iii. Universiti Islam Sultan Sharif Ali (UNISSA),
- iv. Universitas Islam Negeri Antasari (UIN Antasari),
- v. Universiti Fatoni (FTU),
- vi. Kolej Universiti Islam Perlis (KUIPs),
- vii. Kolej Universiti Islam Pahang Sultan Ahmad Shah (KUIPSAS), and
- viii. Kolej Universiti Islam Antarabangsa Selangor (KUIS).

3.2 The AIUA founders accepted the motion by Institut Agama Islam Negeri (IAIN) Ternate.

3.3 The meeting unanimously endorsed and approved Institut Agama Islam (IAI) As-Siddiq Kie Raha, North Moluccas as a member of AIUA. As of 11th November 2017, the total number of AIUA member institutions is 59 (See Appendix A).

4. OPENING SPEECH BY THE AIUA PRESIDENT

4.1 The President expressed his thanks and gratitude to the AIUA delegates from Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Brunei for their attendance in the meeting. The President then expressed his thanks to Institut Agama Islam Negeri (IAIN) Ternate for hosting the 6th AIUA Meeting and Biennial AGM. The President started the meeting by first reviewing the agenda of the meeting; as following:

- i. The 5th AIUA Meeting Minutes approval.
- ii. Matters arising from the previous meeting - Reports on the AIUA Strategic Plan Guidelines by the respective committee:

- a. The Joint Degree Division Committee – UIN Sunan Ampel
 - b. The Joint Research Division Committee – IAIN Palopo
 - c. The Business Economic Partner Division Committee – UNISSA
 - d. The Knowledge Dissemination Division Committee – UIN Antasari
 - e. The Joint Award Division Committee – IAIN Kendari
 - f. The Student Exchange Division Committee – KUIPs
- iii. AIUA Financial Report.
 - iv. Other matters.
 - v. The election of new AIUA Committee Members for the 2017 – 2019 term.
 - vi. Decision on the date, venue and host for the next AIUA meeting.

4.2 The President reminded all AIUA members of their commitments and responsibilities towards the lifetime membership fee payment of USD500.00 to the AIUA account.

5. APPROVAL OF THE PREVIOUS MINUTES

5.1 Kolej Universiti Islam Pahang Sultan Ahmad Shah (KUIPSAS), Malaysia proposed for the 5th AIUA Meeting minutes to be approved. The motion was seconded by Universiti Islam Sultan Sharif Ali (UNISSA), Brunei and Institut Agama Islam Negeri (IAIN) Syekh Nurjati, Cirebon, Indonesia.

6. MATTERS ARISING

6.1 Presentation of Asian Islamic Universities Association (AIUA) Strategic Plan Guidelines

i. Joint Degree Division Committee

Presented by Universitas Islam Negeri (UIN) Sunan Ampel, Surabaya, Indonesia.

The Joint Degree Division Committee noted that:

- a. MOUs are needed to ensure the smooth running of the Joint Degree program(s).
- b. AIUA members are to look deeper into ways of implementing the program(s), and to identify the responsibilities of each AIUA members to ensure the success.
- c. AIUA members must be well-versed in the fields of interest, the rules and regulations, the diversity of policies, as well as the university or country education standards in every member institutions.

ii. Joint Research Division Committee

Presented by Institut Agama Islam Negeri (IAIN) Palopo, South Sulawesi, and Indonesia.

In order to have an effective Joint Research platform between the AIUA member institutions, the committee suggested that AIUA need to:

- a. Have an effective team to run the joint-research division program.

- b. Be ready to collaborate and participate in the research activities by other AIUA member institutions.
- c. Communicate and examine the implementation of inter-university research policies that would benefit the AIUA community development.

iii. **Business Economic Partner Division Committee**

Presented by Universiti Islam Sultan Sharif Ali (UNISSA), Brunei.

The Business Economic Partner Division Committee suggested that:

- a. AIUA should have a source of funding. The proposed sources of funding are from:
 - i. Corporate companies and public figures. The AIUA members should assist the Secretariat in identifying the prospective corporate companies and public figures in order to facilitate AIUA funding.
 - ii. Religious bodies and associations.
 - iii. Patrons such as Asian leaders.
 - iv. Organizing AIUA's seminar, short courses and joint programs.
- b. AIUA should establish the Economic Net Growth by having a close engagement with companies, the public, donors, government and non-government organizations or institutions by capturing and sustaining the future partners' interest on AIUA activities and programs.

- c. AIUA should have a proper mechanism and guidelines for self-funding and financial independence.

iv. **Knowledge Dissemination Division Committee**

Presented by Universitas Islam Negeri (UIN) Antasari, Banjarmasin, Indonesia.

The Knowledge Dissemination Division Committee emphasized on four important fundamentals that AIUA needs to have in the future:

- i. To have joint programs between member institutions.
- ii. To have an indexed journal, following the launching of the Journal of Asian Islamic Higher Institutions (JAIHI). This journal is now managed by the AIUA Secretary-General team.
- iii. To have digitalized and published documents.
- iv. To organize AIUA Conference.

v. **Joint Award Division Committee**

Presented by Institut Agama Islam Negeri (IAIN) Kendari, South East Sulawesi, Indonesia.

The Joint Award Division Committee suggested that:

- a. The first award giving ceremony should commence in 2018.
- b. The proposed award categories are:
 - i. The Best Student(s)
 - ii. The Best Employee(s)

- iii. The Best Institution
 - iv. The Best Researcher(s)
 - v. Young Researcher(s) Award
- c. Two evaluations were proposed as the selection processes for the AIUA Award recipient(s):

i. An evaluation on the members' achievements and accomplishments, locally and internationally.

ii. An evaluation of the members' websites as well as interviews with the candidates. The categories to be evaluated are:

- The number of programs offered
- The number of students enrolled
- The numbers of MOUs and MOAs with the local or international bodies.

vi. **Student Exchange Division Committee**

Presented by Kolej Universiti Islam Perlis (KUIPs), Perlis, Malaysia.

The Student Exchange Division Committee suggested that AIUA should have:

- a. Inter-universities short courses or programs (minimum of two-week duration). The committee will identify suitable curriculum or syllabi for the programs.

- b. Inter-universities courses or programs that will be able to give students opportunities to experience different learning environment.
- c. A transfer credit system. The committee will identify the assessment and evaluation method, as well as the suitable credit for the selected inter-universities courses or programs.
- d. The first program is proposed to start by August 2018.

6.2 Feedback From The Secretary-General

The Secretary-General urged the AIUA members to note the AIUA Strategic Plan Guidelines as matter of high importance, and suggested for the committee members to review and present the following matters in the next AIUA meeting:

- i. To provide a complete, concise and detailed working paper.
- ii. To include a complete implementation procedures for every standard and guidelines.

7. AIUA FINANCIAL REPORT

- 7.1 All members agreed that the AIUA membership fee should be paid by the next AIUA meeting.

9. ADDRESS BY THE NEW AIUA PRESIDENT

9.1 The newly elected President of AIUA (11th November 2017 – 11th October 2019), Prof. Drs. K.H. Yudian Wahyudi, the Rector of Universitas Islam Negeri (UIN) Sunan Kalijaga, Yogyakarta, expressed his admiration on the progress and development made by the Muslim community in Southeast Asia since the death of Ibnu Rushd; a scholar and a philosopher who specialized in religion and science, and after the fall of Andalusia, Melaka & Ternate to the colonial powers. He believed that the Nusantara archipelago had become much stronger since then. He hoped that through the strong bonds among the AIUA members, the Association will be able to further unite and work towards the Muslim community in Asia.

- 9.2 The President promised that he will be dedicating himself to his presidential commitments and ensured that every programs and guidelines that had been presented in the meeting will be prosecuted with haste.
- 9.3 He also emphasized on the importance of members' commitment towards the designated membership fee, and that the financial commitment is much lower compared to any other international associations' membership.
- 9.4 The President ended his speech by stating that he was proud to be elected as the new President of AIUA during a meeting in Ternate; one of the historic Muslim states in Indonesia.

10. OTHER MATTERS

- 10.1 The Chairman announced the upcoming important events which will be held by member institutions:
- i. World Conference on Islamic Thought and Civilization 2017 (WCIT 2017) which will be held at Casuarina @ Meru, Ipoh, Perak, Malaysia on the 20th – 21st November 2017 by Universiti Sultan Azlan Shah (USAS).
 - ii. International Seminar on Deradicalization which will be held in March 2018 at Kolej Universiti Islam Perlis (KUIPs), Perlis, Malaysia.
- 10.2 Members were encouraged to attend and actively participate in AIUA meetings and programs to show their support and commitment to the association.



MULTILATERAL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR DEVELOPING INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE AND ACADEMIC COOPERATION

For the purpose to facilitate greater compatibility and comparability between the diverse Islamic higher education systems and institutions across Asia and developing international cooperation between institutions along with enhancing the quality of Islamic higher education and research, and giving substance to the Asia dimension.

Desiring to provide one another with the fullest mutual assistance possible to facilitate the performance of the functions with which they are entrusted within their respective jurisdictions to enforce or secure compliance with their laws and regulations as those terms are defined herein,

The signatories have agreed to the following provisions:

ARTICLE 1 DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding, the following definitions apply:

"Authority" means those regulators listed in Appendix A, who, in accordance with the procedures set forth in Appendix B, have signed this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding;

"Laws and Regulations" mean the provisions of the laws of the jurisdictions of the Authorities, the regulations promulgated thereunder, and other regulatory requirements that fall within the competence of the Authorities

ARTICLE 2 PURPOSE

The purpose of this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding is to permit the exchange of scholars, professional staff members, students, and academic information between the signatory universities/institutions. By establishing such exchanges, the instructional and research activities at signatory universities/institutions will be enhanced and greater mutual understanding between scholars and students of signatory universities/institutions facilitated.

ARTICLE 3 SCOPE OF INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE AND COOPERATION

1. The signatory universities/institutions to this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding have agreed to promote the following exchange activities based on their respective academic and educational needs:-

- i. Exchange of scholars (professors, advanced graduate fellows, and/or researchers) and professional staff members;
- ii. Exchange of students (graduate and undergraduate);
- iii. Exchange of information and academic materials;
- iv. Organization of joint research programs including those for eventual publication in academic and professional journals;
- v. Organization of joint research programs, as well as exchange of information about conferences, workshops, and mutual assistance to participate in them;

- vi. Collaboration in distance education and information technology;
 - vii. Other feasible and relevant educational activities to be engaged upon according to this agreement and in the spirit of developing education for mutual benefit to the parties, students and the public; and
 - viii. Supporting activities/services such as language training, orientations and preparatory courses are considered.
2. The implementation of each exchange based on this agreement shall be separately negotiated and determined by signatory universities/institutions, and efforts shall be made by all sides to find financial and in-kind resources for implementing specific exchange programs.

ARTICLE 4 AMENDMENT, SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS AND REVIEW OF THIS MULTILATERAL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

1. With the consent of all of the Authorities, this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding may be amended or supplemented.
2. The Authorities shall regularly monitor and review the implementation of this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding and carry out consultations with each other in order to improve its operation and to resolve possible difficulties.

ARTICLE 5 RESOLUTIONS OF DISPUTES

Any difference or dispute between the Authorities concerning the interpretation and/or implementation and/or application of any of the provisions of this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding will be settled amicably through mutual consultation and/or negotiations between the Authorities through diplomatic channels, without reference to any third party or international tribunal.

ARTICLE 6 CONFIDENTIALITY

Each Authority will keep confidential at all times any information or data that may be exchanged, acquired or shared in connection with any programme or activity conducted pursuant to this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding save where the same is already in public domain.

ARTICLE 7 EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION

Cooperation in accordance with this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding will begin on the date of its signing by the Authorities. As to additional Authorities, the Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding will be effective as of the date of that Authority's signing of Appendix A.

This Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding shall last for Five (5) years and shall be reviewed and evaluated after this period.

ARTICLE 8 ADDITIONAL PARTIES

Additional AIUA member may become a party to this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding after its entry into force by signing this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding and giving notice of that fact to Secretary-General.

ARTICLE 9 TERMINATION

An Authority seeking to withdraw from this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding shall provide at least ninety (90) calendar days prior written notice to the other authorities before doing so.

In such cases, programs under way shall be allowed to be completed according to the terms that have been agreed upon.

Any requests for information communicated before the effective date of its withdrawal will be processed under this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding unless the withdrawing Authority requests otherwise.

Following an Authority's withdrawal from this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding, that Authority shall continue to apply the confidentiality protections set out in this Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding and the withdrawal shall not have any impact on that Authority's obligation of cooperation and information exchange under the Laws and Regulations.
